



The Royal Command Performance 60th Anniversary November 4, 1963

This was the night of The Beatles' famous appearance at the Royal Command Performance at the Prince of Wales Theatre in London. By this point Beatlemania was an absolute phenomenon, with the band drawing huge and frenzied audiences across Britain and beyond. They were by far the most anticipated performers to appear.

AMERICAN ENGLISH plays The Beatles "Hey Jude" album in its entirety.

Hey Jude is a 1970 collection of non-album singles and B-sides by The Beatles . Originally released in the United States and various other markets, but not in the United Kingdom, it consisted of non-album singles and B-sides not previously issued on an American Beatles LP. Until the release of The Blue Album 1967-1970 in 1973, Hey Jude was the only way to own the extremely popular "Hey Jude" single on LP or in a Stereo mix. The songs "Rain", "Lady Madonna" and "Revolution" were also first mixed for stereo specifically for this album. Prior to the release of the "Get Back" single in the spring of 1969, all Beatles singles were issued in mono in the US.

In the US, the album sold 2,321,769 copies by 31 December 1970 and 3,264,398 copies by the end of the decade. It endures as a fan favorite among enthusiasts worldwide and features some of the last promo photos ever taken of The Beatles as a group.
